OLC Awards for Courseware Implementations That Grow Student Success



The Online Learning Consortium's (OLC) annual Digital Learning Innovation Award (DLIAward) program recognizes faculty-led

teams and institutions for advancing undergraduate student success through the adoption of digital courseware. To accelerate implementation of digital courseware that increases student success, OLC is calling for submissions from accredited U.S.-based institutions in two categories:

- Institutional Award – \$100,000 (up to three awarded)
- Faculty-led Team Award – \$10,000 (up to 10 awarded)
